

When to Call to Schedule your Child for a Sick Appointment:

- Rectal temp of 100.4 F and is less than 3 months of age.
- Rectal temp of 101 F or higher and is 3-6 months of age.
- Rectal temp of 102 F or higher and is older than 6 months of age.
- Diarrhea or vomiting that is severe or frequent, or lasts several hours.
- Blood in the stool, urine or vomit.
- Lingering or unusual cough.
- Has not been eating.
- Newborn who appears sick in any way.
- Will not stop crying.
- Unusually sleepy or limp.
- Is having a problem moving around.
- Cannot swallow
- Rash.
- Bitten by an animal or another human.
- Swelling in any part of the body.
- Any problem that is worsening or will not go away.

Dial 9-1-1 or proceed to the nearest Emergency Room or Urgent Care Center if your child:

- Choking or having trouble breathing.
- Convulsing.
- Unconscious or will not respond.
- Lips or skin that has turned blue, purple or gray.
- Bleeding heavily.
- Serious injury or burn.
- Poisonous bite or sting.
- Child has eaten or drunk poison-even if there are no symptoms. Call poison Control 800-222-1222
